

Course Catalogs relevant to BerGSAS students

Introduction

This document aims to give you an overview of the different courses you are able to attend during your doctoral studies at the BerGSAS, and to help you navigate the course catalogs of the different institutions, as well as to answer some common questions. Use the navigation pane in Word (view→navigation pane) or Adobe (bookmarks) for easier navigation, open and close headings to show/hide more information. Some of the course catalogs are only available in German, we recommend using the translation feature most browsers have integrated, or applications like Google Lens to translate them, should you desire. The course catalogs are subject to change, and you will have to ensure you have selected the correct semester. Especially before the start of the semester, they can appear rather empty because not all courses will have been added. Simply check back shortly before the semester starts, to get a full overview. FAQ

Q: Does this overview include all courses?

A: No. The BerGSAS and its partners also organize courses specifically for doctoral students that differ every semester. These will be announced internally.

Q: Where are the courses for PhD students? All the courses listed within the links found in this document are for Master's students.

A: Except for the Berlin University Alliance (BUA), none of the institutions listed here offer courses specifically designed for doctoral students. All courses listed in the course catalogs that are marked as being for Master's students can be recognized for your degree, provided that the respective course fits the curriculum of your BerGSAS doctoral program (for a list and description of the curriculum, see § 11 in the rules and regulations for your BerGSAS doctoral program that can be downloaded from the BerGSAS website). If you are unsure whether you can receive credits for a course, please contact the coordinator of your program (Regina Attula or Carmen Marcks-Jacobs). You can only receive credits for Bachelor's courses under very special circumstances (see: HTW excavation techniques degree).

Q: Can I get credits for courses not listed here?

A: Yes. If you encounter a relevant course, and the coordinators agree to it, you can get it recognized. An example might include an archaeo-botanist taking a course in botany at the faculty of biology.

Q: Can I get credits for courses offered at all the institutions listed here?

A: Yes. Provided that the respective course fits the curriculum of your BerGSAS doctoral program, you can get credits for courses offered at all the listed institutions.

Q: How can I enrol in a course?

A:

FU-students: Unfortunately, doctoral students belonging to the FU cannot sign up for courses online. You will have to contact the lecturers via email, or in person to let them know that you would like to participate in their course.

HU-students: HU doctoral students can register online for a course taking place at the HU via the AGNES portal ([Humboldt-Universität zu Berlin - Vorlesungsverzeichnis](#)). If you want to sign up for a course at the other institutions, you will have to contact the lecturers via email, or in person to let them know that you would like to participate in their course.

Q: Am I guaranteed a spot in the courses?

A: No. Besides the possibility of the course already being fully booked, requirements for languages or previous training might apply.

Q: Are all courses offered in English?

A: No. While there are courses in English, most courses offered are in German. Check the course catalogs for detailed information. In agreement with the lecturer, you may be able to write the assignments, and participate in the course in English.

Q: Which subject course catalogs are relevant for me?

A: The subjects listed below do not correspond directly to the doctoral subjects or programs. Multiple subjects will fit your doctoral program. At the same time, not every course from those subjects will be relevant to you. Please read the whole list and check which subjects are relevant to you as per § 11 of the rules and regulations for your BerGSAS doctoral program (available for download on the BerGSAS website). Also take note of the “soft skill/key qualifications” section. If you are unsure whether you can receive credits for a course, please contact the coordinator of your program (Regina Attula or Carmen Marcks-Jacobs).

Q: Can I take optional courses, without receiving credits?

A: Yes. If the lecturer agrees to it, you can participate in courses, even when they cannot be recognized for your curriculum.

Q: Where can I find more information about the courses?

A: Some institutions do not have very detailed course catalogs. Check the faculty websites, to see if they offer an annotated course catalog (“kommentiertes Vorlesungsverzeichnis”) in the form of a PDF. If you are unsure whether a course is useful for your studies, you can contact the lecturer.

Freie Universität Berlin (FU) course catalog:

Filter first by semester, then filter by departments (most courses relevant to BerGSAS doctoral students are found either under „history and cultural studies“ or „philosophy and Humanities“). Then click on the individual course catalogs of the different Master (M.A.) subjects.

Humboldt-Universität zu Berlin (HU) course catalog:

Only available in German. Filter first by semester, then by department/Fakultät (most courses relevant to BerGSAS doctoral student are found either under „Philosophische Fakultät“, „Sprach- und Literaturwissenschaftliche Fakultät“, „Kultur-, Sozial- und Bildungswissenschaftliche Fakultät“ and „Theologische Fakultät“). Then navigate through the subdepartments and the subjects. Then you will have to individually open the various modules/types of courses to see what courses are offered as part of them.

Technische Universität Berlin (TU) course catalog:

Some modules can be found in the central course catalog of the TU (most relevant courses are found within the section „Fakultät I“ or „Fakultät VI“), but others are only described in annotated course catalogs. We therefore recommend that you look for the current annotated course catalogs for the individual degrees, which you can find as PDFs on the institutes' websites or under the subject-specific links listed below.

Universität Potsdam (UP) course catalog:

Filter first by semester (top right corner), then select the faculty (virtually all relevant courses are part of the “Philosophische Fakultät”). Then navigate through the institutes and select the Master option. Click on the most recent exam regulation (“Prüfungsversion/Studienordnung” you can find). You will have to individually open the various modules to see what courses are offered as part of them.

Hochschule für Technik und Wirtschaft Berlin (HTW-B) course catalog:

The HTW-B specialises in applied sciences and offers various courses related to conservation, excavation, and presentation of ancient artifacts. Navigate to „Gestaltung und Kultur“, select the relevant subject, and then navigate through the semesters (not relevant to you) and modules to find lists of the individual courses. So far only a few BerGSAS students have taken regular courses at the HTW, but if the respective lecturers there agree to you attending their course, you can get it accredited.
