However, it is often difficult to establish a dialogue between the narratives emerging from these various sources and understand them in the same interpretative framework.

This problem is even more pressing since there is a high degree of specialization in the respective fields.

In this workshop, we bring together specialists of different aspects of ancient economy to assess how different types of sources can be combined.
